





McKesson leased the entire building in Manteno last year as it prepared to ship vaccines across the country. Now the company is paying rent to a new landlord, but no one knows how long McKesson will stick around.



As the federal government was putting the pieces in place to distribute COVID-19 vaccines last year, good fortune visited the owner of a big warehouse in Manteno, about 50 miles south of Chicago.

The 570,000-square-foot building was empty after losing its two tenants about a year earlier. Along came McKesson, a big pharmaceutical distributor working with the Centers for Disease Control on its vaccing rellout. In August 2020, Irving Toyas-based




