Percentile Definitions:

The hourly earnings for occupations. Occupations have hourly earnings for five percentiles (10th, 25th, 50th [median], 75th, and 90th) as well as the mean & average.

For example, 10th percentile earnings of \$12/hr indicate that 90% of the workers in that occupation make MORE than \$12/hr.

Median earnings of \$15/hr would mean that half of workers in that occupation make more, and half make less.

10th percentile earnings are often used as a proxy for entry level wages, as they represent the lowest earnings in the occupation.
